1. OUR STORY



Animal-Mama is a non-profit Veterinary Clinic and Pet Wellness Centre that aims to provide unique, holistic, healthy, affordable, and personalized pet services, products, and healthcare to pet owners in Cambodia.

Our fully equipped & operational Veterinary Clinic offers general surgery, orthopaedic surgery, spay & neuter surgery, vaccinations, microchips; diagnosis & treatment; international pet travel & export permits; pet taxi; grooming; pet hotel; homemade pet food & treats and much more.

SOCTAL ENTERPRISE

As a social enterprise, the profits are used to help street animals who are in dire situations because of sickness and injury; help with free treatment and vaccination of animals for the poor communities; provide highly discounted and/or free services to other animal shelters and animal rescue agencies in Cambodia. We also proactively engaged in a country-wide education about animal welfare to the public and many of our community projects focus on Spay/Neuter Programs, Street Rescues & Adoptions, and Long-Term Special Needs Care.





In addition, since the opening of Animal-Mama, we have made it possible for free anti-rabies vaccinations of street animals and we proactively celebrate World Rabies Day together with Global Alliance for Rabies Control. In Cambodia, approximately 800 people die of rabies every year, and these are the cases are are officially reported. Unreported cases can make this figure much higher.

Almost all cases from a dog infected with the rabies virus are fatal. Rabies has the highest mortality rate of all diseases and more than 40% of those affected are children. Reporting of these cases is extremely poor, as rabies has its greatest impact on the most underserved populations, in rural areas or the communities that have no access to medical and veterinary services.

We take part in World Rabies Day and offer FREE Rabies Vaccinations for pet owners. We also go out into the community to administer FREE vaccines to the local residents' pets. We take a science-led approach, focusing on the collaboration between animal and human health organisations which is essential to the success of our actions and activities. Our Rabies Eradication Program is run alongside our Pagoda Spay/Neuter Program where we Desex, Vaccinate, Treat, and Microchip every animal. Global Alliance for Rabies Control



NOT AN NGO



Given that we are NOT a donation based NPO, we do not spend any resources on fundraising and do not actively seek or depend on any regular outside funding. As such we have only our own resources to help all the street and pagoda animals who need it. We are also NOT a publicly funded animal shelter, and with our current space and funds capacity we can only take in a small number of animals at any one time.

Although, we would love to help every animal, we have our limitations and have to focus our resources on the very worst cases who need our help the most

JOIN THE MOVEMENT

There is only so much we can do on our own, so we are encouraging participation, donations, and sponsorships from individuals and organisations who want to get involved and help the animals in Cambodia.

If you find an animal who needs helps, then as a veterinary clinic we can, of course, provide this help, but we just can't afford to absorb the costs for everything ourselves for every animal. If you find an animal in need and want to help them, we encourage people to take personal responsibility for their rescues and help by paying towards their treatment.



We also offer free pet care advice and veterinary advice to help you can foster and care for the animal yourself in your own home, until the animal is healthy, vaccinated and desexed and then release them back where you found them or find them an adoptive family when they can live happy life and back to full health...

We are also proud to have developed our Animal Mama's Foster Family Network, where we get different places for abandoned and rescued animals with short and long term foster homes. PUBLIC HEALTH

When we discuss public health in regards to animal welfare, we are not only talking about people's daily well-being, but also about how we must act to prevent zoonotic diseases related to and transmitted among animals and by animals to humans; how we educate society to know the diseases and how they are transmitted from animals to people; and finally how to channel the message of public health protection to the entire country.



2. WHAT DO WE DO?

As mentioned above, our work has a very important element of bringing proactive animal welfare awareness in Cambodia. It is important to change the way people see and treat animals to more inclusive, kind and benevolent. To that end, our mission is also to extend our work to the rest of the country and if possible, to the rest of the world.

For this reason, Yulia Khouri, the founder of Animal Mama, writes a weekly column in the national newspaper, Khmer Times https://www.khmertimeskh.com/category/good-times2/ about animal welfare, care and respect for any animal - domesticated or wildlife - that is harmed and endangered in Cambodia and globally.







7. WHAT IS OUR INTERNSHIP?

SURGERY*

Castration;

Depending on the student's knowledge, he or she may be able to perfect the spaying and neutering technique or, learn the necessary procedures to be able to perform the surgery following the correct protocol. In addition, the training will include training about anesthesia, sterility in surgery, catheter, IV fluids, etc...

Other types of surgery;

- Amputation of extremities
- Eye enucleations
- Traumatological surgery
- Dental cleaning and extraction of teeth

CONSULTATION

In our daily consultations we perform;

- Assessments of patients
- Diagnosis of diseases
- Sample collection & analysis
- Preventative Care
- Treatments
- Patient follow-ups
- Study of extraordinary clinical cases







LABORATORY

- Coprological Analysis
- Parasite detection under a microscope
- Blood Analysis using Biochemical machine model **Idexx Catalyst One** (Biochemistry, computer program and Snap Pro Analyzer Idexx tests)
- Hematology Blood Analysis
- Urine analysis
- Skin scrapes for microscopic analysis for external parasites

HOSPITALISATION

- **Daily Patient Monitoring**
- Decision Making (supervised)
- Treatments and Dosages (supervised)
- Quarantine maintenance
- Shelter monitoring and evaluation

SHELTER MEDICINE

Everything related to care, attention, needs and management of an animal shelter. It is important to understand how to rescue, where and how rescued animals live, what traumatizes them and how to help them to be ready for adoption by families or individuals. Part of this process is socializing the animals as well as educating the potential adoptive families on how to give their adopted animals the medical care they need, provide love as well as understand how to continue helping others.

PAGODA ANIMALS

One of the main social projects that we carry out from Animal Mama. We aim to control overpopulation in Pagodas in the city through trap/spay/release program and prevent/treat the diseases in the animals that live in pagodas. The project consists of providing animals with medical care they need and releasing them back into their habitat only when their are fully healthy. Medical attention covers any problems the animal may have. From simple deworming to operations of any kind. It is a project that we carry out every week of the year.

SOCIAL EDUCATION

-Understand the importance of education in society, starting with the youngest. School visits, demonstrating to children how to treat animals; conveying the respect and affection humans should show for animals and most importantly how to interact with animals peacefully, in order to create positive and peaceful coexistence between humans and animals.

- Animal Mama Veterinary Hospital provides laboratory and veterinary services to WA
- We engage in awareness raising, publicity and Education about wildlife in Cambodia & abroad
- We engage in annual and semi-annual events and fundraising activities to support WA projects
- We provide the PR services to several key projects of WA
- Our facility serves as a drop off point for the rescued or injured wildlife to be immediately transferred to the WA rescue team.
- Therefore, based in experience, the interns will have an opportunity to visit Wildlife Rescue Center as well as provide their skills in support of Wildlife Alliance in Cambodia

THE HOME OF HEROES

- The Home of Heroes is the world's first Retirement Home for working demining dogs
- According to Memorandum of Understanding between Animal Mama and Norwegian People's Aids all dogs that are unfit to work - sick, injured, retired and disqualified dogs, including young dogs who failed to qualify for the field work - will not be donated to Home of Heroes.
- The dogs recipe necessary veterinary attention and daily care.
- The dogs will soon enroll in the special training programme for agility, personal protection and depending on the skills, the interns will have a chance to provide daily, weekly, monthly veterinary and behavioral care to the Canine Heroes.





2. THE HOME OF HEROES

Home of heroes is the first retirement home in the world for demining dogs who have become too old to work in the field.

In early 2016, we received our first ex-demining dog called Murial, she is now 12 years old. This led us to open the world's first retirement home for ex-deming working dogs.

3. PAGODA SPAY/NEUTER

There are fifty Pagodas in Central Phnom Penh, each with approximately forty cats and dogs. Most of these animals are either abandoned and homeless. They get no veterinary care and most survice as best they can with rice and scraps given by the monks and local residents. They suffer from illness (often zoonotic) and injuries and being intact, the breeding adds to the Pagoda overpopulation problem.
